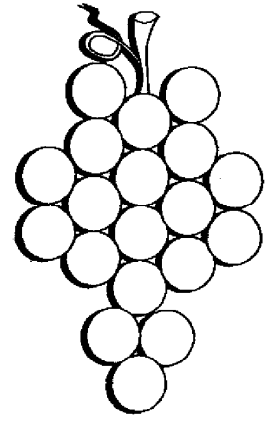

Jokingly, I suggested that the laboratory must be somewhere high-tec, like Germany. 'No', he said, 'It's made here in Marlborough'.

Ever since then, I have wondered what else might be made in Marlborough without a lot of us being aware of it. The time has come to find out!

This year for our Harvest celebrations, we plan to celebrate local manufacturing by having a week-end exhibition in St. Mary's of things that are actually made locally in Marlborough, Manton and Minal. The idea is that local firms or individuals will provide a sample of their work and a display which gives an indication of the processes involved that lead to the finished product.

On Friday, 1st October we hope to formally open the event at 6.00pm in the church. The exhibition will be open during the day on Saturday and on Sunday, 3rd October there will be a special Harvest Festival service which would celebrate the diversity and extent of what actually is made in our local community.

We have used the Chamber of Commerce as well as individuals from across the churches to ensure that we contact as wide a group of people as possible, but if you have knowledge of firms or individuals who make things, no matter how small the scale of operation, please let either Bruce Hayllar (512435) or me (514357) know.

Nearer the time, we will need help in setting up the exhibition as well as stewards over the week end.

Given that the summer holidays haven't started yet, it might seem a long way off to talk about October, but we all know how time rushes away from us. I would welcome any ideas you might have about how to improve this project and how to best publicise it.

## **SOMA TEAM TO RUWENZORI DIOCESE**

29 June – 13 July 2010

I would be very grateful for your prayers for this forthcoming SOMA Mission which I am taking part in.

### **Background**

In 2004 Bishop Benezeri Kitembo and his wife Lovey visited the Bath & Wells Diocese, before the SOMA conference at Canterbury. An invitation for a team to go to Ruwenzori came in November 2009 from the new Bishop Patrick Kyaligonza, previously the Dean of the Diocese, who also came on the visit to Bath & Wells. Tragically, Patrick was killed in a car accident in February 2010. Since then the planning for the visit has been continued by Benezeri Kitembo, now acting as Bishop. The catalyst for the visit is the Golden Jubilee for the Diocese.

### **The Team**

### **The Programme**

We will leave the UK on the evening of the 29<sup>th</sup> June arriving at Entebbe Airport in Uganda the next afternoon. We will then travel to Fort Portal, a journey of about 200 miles. We will be leading 2 conferences. The first for Mission Co-ordinators is from 1<sup>st</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> July and the second for Archdeacons and Senior Clergy from 6<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup> July. The theme for both is from Acts 1:8, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be my witnesses..."

The programme is very full – details will be appearing on the Mission Notice board in St. Mary's. We would value your prayers. Each team member is responsible for paying for their own costs but Ruwenzori Diocese has requested help from SOMA in funding the conference for their delegates. If you would like to help with this please make a cheque to SOMA (UK) and pass to me or Gill McColl and we will forward it on to SOMA.
